

Over-representation of Aboriginal young people (10-17 years) in the NSW Criminal Justice System, 2018-2022

Aboriginal young people (aged 10-17) comprise of approx. 6% of the NSW juvenile population^

POLICE COURT ACTIONS




In 2022, **54%** of young people proceeded against to court by police were Aboriginal*

Aboriginal young people proceeded to court:

34% in 5 yrs

Total young people proceeded to court:

2% in 5 yrs



COURT BAIL DECISIONS



In 2022, **66%** of young people who were refused bail at their first court bail appearance were Aboriginal*

Aboriginal juvenile defendants refused bail: 1 8% in 5 yrs

Total juvenile defendants refused bail: 4 5% in 5 yrs

FOUND GUILTY IN COURT




In 2022, **50%** of all proven juvenile court appearances involved an Aboriginal defendant

Aboriginal proven juvenile court appearances: 14% in 5 yrs

Total proven juvenile court appearances: 16% in 5 yrs

SENTENCED TO CUSTODY



In 2022, **79%** of custodial sentences handed down by the courts to juveniles were to Aboriginal defendants

Aboriginal youth custodial sentences: 51% in 5 yrs

Total youth custodial sentences: 57% in 5 yrs

In Dec 2022, **50%** of the juvenile custody~ population was Aboriginal
