

RECORDED CRIME MONITORING REPORT REJECTED INCIDENTS

RECORDED CRIME DATA TO JUNE 2023

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

- Across the selected offences, two regional trends and five metropolitan trends would have been less favourable if rejected incidents had been included. [See Table 1]
- There was an 8.8 per cent downtrend in total rejected incidents in the 24 months to June 2023, with 4.2 per cent of all incidents rejected in the 12 months to June 2023. [See Table 2]
- *Prohibited and regulated weapons offences* had an upward trend in rejected incidents (31.8%). [See Table 2]
- Eight offences had a downward trend in rejected incidents: *Domestic violence related assault (down 18.8%), Non-domestic violence related assault (-13.9%), Other offences against the person (-39.4%), Break and enter dwelling (-9.1%), Steal from dwelling (-22.9%), Breach bail conditions (-15.6%), Transport regulatory offences (-30.8%) and Other offences (-86.4%)*. [See Table 2]
- Fifteen offences had a rejection rate above five per cent: *Domestic violence related assault (11.1%), Non-domestic violence related assault (9.3%), Sexual assault (7.7%), Sexual touching, sexual act and other sexual offences (5.7%), Abduction and kidnappingⁱ (17.7%), Robbery without a weapon (15.0%), Robbery with a weapon not a firearm (8.1%), Other offences against the person (5.1%), Break and enter dwelling (8.1%), Motor vehicle theftⁱⁱ (8.3%), Steal from dwelling (7.8%), Steal from person (20.2%), Stock theft (12.7%), Fraud (5.7%) and Breach Apprehended Violence Order (10.5%)* [See Table 2].
- For the selected offences across NSW PACs/PDs, there were twenty-one uptrends and forty-nine downtrends in rejected incidents in the 24 months to June 2023, compared to twenty-seven uptrends and twenty-seven downtrends in the previous report to September 2022.
- The majority of uptrends were in *Intimidation, stalking and harassment* (three PACs/PDs), *Fraud* (four PACs/PDs) and *Breach Apprehended Violence Order* (eight PACs/PDs, up from five in the previous report). [See Table 3]
- Two PACs/PDs showed uptrends in both rejected incidents of *Intimidation, stalking and harassment* and rejected *Breach Apprehended Violence Order* incidents: Fairfield City (47.2% and 44.7% respectively) and Liverpool City (151.2% and 88.1%). [See Table 3]
- Murray River had downtrends in rejected incidents for six offences, including the largest downtrend of any PAC/PD for four offences (*Non-domestic violence related assault, Break and enter dwelling, Malicious damage to property and Breach Apprehended Violence Order*).
- *Breach Apprehended Violence Order* had a high and upward trending rejection rate in seven PACs/PDs. Campbelltown City, Fairfield City, Liverpool City and Wollongong had high and upward trending rejection rates for two offence types each. [See Table 4]
- The highest rejection rate across all PACs/PDs for selected offences was *Steal from person in South Coast* (52.2%). [See Table 4]
- Thirty-five PACs/PDs had high rejection rates (above 9%) for *Breach Apprehended Violence Order* with uptrends in seven PACs/PDs. *Domestic violence related assault* had high rates in 30 PACs/PDs, down from 42 in the previous report with downtrends in nine PACs/PDs. [See Table 4]

INTRODUCTION

Crime trends in NSW are based on crimes recorded by police and accepted by them as genuine. The trend in any offence can be affected by the percentage of crimes 'rejected' by police as not genuine. Crime trends may also be affected by criminal matters being recorded as non-criminal incidents.

The Bureau monitors trends in the percentage of rejected incidents to see whether they could be affecting the trend in recorded crime. Where a significant upward trend in the number of rejected crime reports is detected, steps are taken to determine whether the police are complying with the NSW Police Crime Recording Standard (see below).

It bears emphasis that criminal incidents may validly be rejected, and hence not counted as crimes, when it can be proven that the alleged incident did not occur. Certain offence types may validly have relatively high levels of rejected incidents. For example, abduction and kidnappingⁱ, sexual assault and breach Apprehended Violence Order may involve false reports that can be disproved on further investigation. Stock theft may be reported when stock have wandered off rather than being stolen. A motor vehicle may be reported as stolen but then later the owner may advise that they had simply forgotten where they had left the vehicleⁱⁱ. Vehicles are also sometimes reported stolen by their owners in a bid to defraud insurance companies.

Drivers may forget to pay for petrol before driving off from a service station, but then later realise and return to pay. Following a change to Police procedure from September 2013, whereby service stations are required to fax a form to report petrol theft, fewer of these incidents were reported.

A significant increase in the percentage of crimes rejected does not in and of itself indicate that police are trying to manipulate crime figures to create the appearance of a decrease in crime. It is important to examine the scale of the increase in rejected incidents (is it large enough to have affected trends in recorded crime?), whether the level of rejection lies within acceptable bounds (does it exceed five per cent?) and whether the police can give a satisfactory explanation for the rise in rejected incidents.

PAC/PD – Police Area Command/Police District

A 2018 re-engineering of Police commands replaced Local Area Commands (LACs) with PACs in metropolitan areas and PDs in regional areas. There was some consolidation of commands and so the Police areas in this report are not directly comparable with those prior to the March 2019 report.

Police – NSW Police Force (NSWPF)

Rejected – rejected incidents are not included in the recorded crime statistics.

The NSW Police Force Crime Recording Standard (December 2015) states:

An INCIDENT should only be classified as '**Rejected**' if verifiable information indicates that the crime / matter did not occur.

Where information exists to indicate the crime / incident did not occur, or has no foundation (i.e., retraction statement of person reporting, observations of independent witnesses, CCTV, etc), the Incident Classification (Veracity) should be recorded as '**Rejected**'.

This Incident Status refers to reports that have no foundation (i.e., inquiries following the initial report clearly indicate that the crime / incident did not occur).

The reason(s) for classifying an INCIDENT as '**Rejected**' should be described in the Event Narrative.

Selected offences – selected offences are the standard 13 major offences from the Recorded Crime Statistics reporting plus two justice offences: *breach bail conditions* and *breach Apprehended Violence Order*:

1. Murder
2. Domestic violence related assault
3. Non-domestic violence related assault
4. Sexual assault
5. Sexual touching, sexual act and other sexual offences
6. Robbery*
7. Break and enter dwelling
8. Break and enter non-dwelling
9. Motor vehicle theftⁱⁱ
10. Steal from motor vehicle
11. Steal from retail store
12. Other stealing offences
13. Malicious damage to property
14. Breach Apprehended Violence Order
15. Breach bail conditions

* Robbery is presented as a single category in Table 1 (NSW, regional and metropolitan trends for selected offences) and three robbery offence types in Table 2 (trends across all offence types).

Trend test - 'Kendall's rank-order correlation test' is used to determine whether there has been an upward or downward trend in the number of criminal incidents over the most recent 24-month period.

ANALYSIS OF THE EFFECT OF 'REJECTED' INCIDENTS ON STATE-WIDE AND REGIONAL TRENDS

Trend tests were applied to total incident counts (accepted plus rejected) and the results compared with the state, regional and metropolitan recorded crime data (which excludes rejected incidents). NSW trends for all offences and regional trends for selected offences were considered. Conflicting results were highlighted, and PAC/PD-level data investigated for these offences, to isolate areas where the classification of incidents as 'Rejected' by individual PACs/PDs had affected any state-level or regional trend.

A) NSW AND REGIONAL TRENDS AFFECTED BY REJECTED INCIDENTS

A summary of inconsistencies between reported trends (accepted incidents) and those that would result from total incidents (accepted plus rejected incidents) is given in the Appendix at Table 1.

This table shows that for the selected offences at the state, regional and metropolitan level, where 20 or more incidents were rejected in each of the relevant two years, no State trend but two regional trends and five metropolitan trends would have been less favourable had all rejected incidents been included in the data.

This compares with three regional trends and one metropolitan trend in the previous report (September Quarter 2022 data).

Two Regional trends:

- Greater Sydney: *Breach Apprehended Violence Order* would have changed from stable to an uptrend (5.2%) if rejected incidents had been included
- Riverina: *Motor vehicle theftⁱⁱ* would have changed from a 10.7 per cent downtrend to stable if rejected incidents had been included

Five Metropolitan trends:

- Sydney – Blacktown: *Other stealing offences* would have changed from stable to a 9.0 per cent uptrend
- Sydney – Inner South West: *Breach Apprehended Violence Order* would have changed from stable to a 14.0 per cent uptrend
- Sydney - North Sydney And Hornsby: *Motor vehicle theftⁱⁱ* would have changed from stable to a 22.9 per cent uptrend
- Sydney - South West: both *Domestic violence related assault* and *Breach Apprehended Violence Order* would have changed from stable to an uptrend (14.4% and 10.7% respectively)

B) REJECTED INCIDENTS ACROSS ALL OFFENCES FOR NSW

Table 2 in the Appendix shows a downtrend (-8.8%) in rejected incidents across total offences for NSW over the two years to June 2023, with rejected incidents decreasing from 4.4% to 4.2% of all incidents.

In the 12 months to June 2023, a total of 27,624 incidents were rejected compared with 30,283 incidents in the previous 12 months.

Trends by offence

There were sufficient rejected incidents to conduct a trend test for 34 of the 62 offence types:

- One offence had an uptrend: *Prohibited and regulated weapons offences* (up 31.8%)
- Eight offences had downtrends in rejected incidents, compared with five offences in the previous report (September Quarter 2022 data):
 - *Domestic violence related assault* (down 18.8%, from 14.3% to 11.1% of incidents)
 - *Non-domestic violence related assault* (down 13.9%, from 12.2% to 9.3% of incidents)
 - *Other offences against the person* (down 39.4%, from 7.2% to 5.1% of incidents)
 - *Break and enter dwelling* (down 9.1%, from 9.6% to 8.1% of incidents)

- *Steal from dwelling* (down 22.9%, from 9.8% to 7.8% of incidents)
- *Breach bail conditions* (down 15.6%, from 1.6% to 1.3% of incidents)
- *Transport regulatory offences* (down 30.8%, the rejected rate unchanged at 0.1%)
- *Other offences* (down 86.4%, down from 0.8% to 0.7% of incidents)
- Twenty four offences were stable and 29 had insufficient numbers to conduct a trend test

Rejection rates above five per cent

Table 2 shows that for all 62 offences at the State level (where more than 20 incidents were rejected in the past year) there were fifteen offences with a rejection rate above five per cent in the 12 months to June 2023:

- *Domestic violence related assault* (11.1%)
- *Non-domestic violence related assault* (9.3%)
- *Sexual assault* (7.7%)
- *Sexual touching, sexual act and other sexual offences* (5.7%)
- *Abduction and kidnappingⁱ* (17.7%)
- *Robbery without a weapon* (15.0%)
- *Robbery with a weapon not a firearm* (8.1%)
- *Other offences against the person* (5.1%)
- *Break and enter dwelling* (8.1%)
- *Motor vehicle theftⁱⁱ* (8.3%)
- *Steal from dwelling* (7.8%)
- *Steal from person* (20.2%)
- *Stock theft* (12.7%)
- *Fraud* (5.7%)
- *Breach Apprehended Violence Order* (10.5%)

This compares with seventeen offences in the September 2022 report.

C) PAC/PD TRENDS IN REJECTED INCIDENTS

Table 3 of the Appendix summarises the results of significant trend tests for any PAC/PD that rejected at least 20 incidents in both the 12 months to June 2023 and the previous 12 months.

For the selected offences across NSW PACs/PDs, there were 21 uptrends and 49 downtrends in rejected incidents in the 24 months to June 2023. This compares with 27 uptrends and 27 downtrends in the previous report on data to September 2022.

Trends in rejection rates

There were upward trends in rejected incidents of:

- *Domestic violence related assault* in one PAC/PD, down from eight in the previous report
- *Non-domestic violence related assault* in two PACs/PDs, down from three in the previous report
- *Intimidation, stalking and harassment* in three PACs/PDs, down from five in the previous report
- *Motor vehicle theftⁱⁱ* in one PD
- *Fraud* in four PACs/PDs, up from two in the previous report
- *Malicious damage to property* in two PACs/PDs, down from three in the previous report
- *Breach Apprehended Violence Order* in eight PACs/PDs, up from five in the previous report

Two PACs/PDs showed uptrends in both rejected incidents of *Intimidation, stalking and harassment* and rejected *Breach Apprehended Violence Order* incidents: Fairfield City (47.2% and 44.7% respectively) and Liverpool City (151.2% and 88.1%).

There were 49 downtrends in rejected incidents compared with 27 in the previous report (September Quarter 2022):

- *Domestic violence related assault* – fourteen PACs/PDs had downtrends in rejected incidents, the largest in Manning/Great Lakes (-60.7%), Murray River (-60.4%) and Auburn (-51.7%)
- *Non-domestic violence related assault* – downtrends in seven PACs/PDs, with the largest in Murray River (-61.5%), Central West (-55.4%) and Camden (-53.7%)
- *Intimidation, stalking and harassment* – three PACs/PDs had downward trends
- *Break and enter dwelling* – three PACs/PDs, with the largest in Murray River (-53.1%)
- *Fraud* – seven PACs/PDs including Eastern Suburbs (-46.7%) and Port Stephens-Hunter (-43.6%)
- *Malicious damage to property* – six PACs/PDs had downtrends in rejected incidents, the largest in Murray River (-47.1%)
- *Breach Apprehended Violence Order* – there were downtrends in four PACs/PDs, with Murray River (52.6%) the largest

Murray River and The Hume both had downtrends in rejected incidents across six offence types each, South Coast had a downtrend in five offence types and a further five PACs/PDs had downtrends in three offences.

Murray River had the largest downtrend in rejected incidents of any PAC/PD for four offences (*Non-domestic violence related assault, Break and enter dwelling, Malicious damage to property and Breach Apprehended Violence Order*).

High and increasing rejection rates

A number of PACs/PDs had high and increasing rejection rates [See Table 4 which lists offences by PAC/PD with rejection rates of nine per cent or higher].

Campbelltown City, Fairfield City, Liverpool City and Wollongong each had high and upward trending rejection rates for two offence types. A further eight PACs/PDs had high and upward trending rejection rates for one offence type each.

Breach Apprehended Violence Order had a high and upward trending rejection rate in seven PACs/PDs.

D) OFFENCE CATEGORIES IN PACS/PDS WITH HIGHEST REJECTION RATES

Table 4 in the Appendix shows offence incidents recorded by NSW PACs/PDs where the rejection rate was higher than nine per cent in the 12 months to June 2023 and there were at least 20 incidents rejected in that period.

There are 195 records in the table, compared with 245 records in the September 2022 report and there are 16 records with an upward trend, compared with 15 in that previous report.

The highest rejection rate across all PACs/PDs for selected offences was *Steal from person* in South Coast (52.2%) and four PACs/PDs had high rejection rates for this offence.

Seven offences had rejection rates above nine per cent in at least ten PACs/PDs:

- *Domestic violence related assault* had high rejection rates in 30 PACs/PDs compared with 42 in the previous report to September 2022
 - Only one PAC/PD showed an uptrend in rejected incidents (Liverpool City 10.1%) compared with eight PACs/PDs in the previous report
 - Nine PACs/PDs had downtrends, an increase on the two in the previous report. The largest downtrends were in Auburn (-51.7%) and Tweed/Byron (-45.9%)
- *Non-domestic violence related assault* had high rejection rates in 27 PACs/PDs, down from 36 PACs/PDs in the previous report, with:
 - two uptrends – Campbelltown City (62.3%) and Fairfield City (29.8%)
 - three downtrends including Monaro (-36.2%)
- *Break and enter dwelling* had high rejection rates in 22 PACs/PDs, down from 28 in the last report:
 - Two PACs/PDs had downtrends - South Sydney (-33.0%) and The Hume (-46.5%) – and there were no upward trends
- *Motor vehicle theft*ⁱⁱ had high rejection rates in 20 PACs/PDs, down from 25 in the previous report. There was one uptrend (Wollongong up 85% from 9.5% to 14.7%) and 14 were stable.
- *Steal from dwelling* had high rejection rates in 22 PACs/PDs, down from 30 in the previous report. There were downtrends in four PACs/PDs, the largest in Inner West (-41.3). Fifteen PACs/PDs were stable and there were no uptrends.
- *Fraud* had high rejection rates in 12 PACs/PDs, down from 15 in the previous report. There was one downtrend (South Coast -33.3%) and three uptrends including 222.9% in Wollongong and 98.8% in Sutherland Shire
- *Breach Apprehended Violence Order* had high rejection rates in 35 PACs/PDs compared with 34 in the last report. There were uptrends in seven PACs/PDs, including three where the numbers doubled: Hawkesbury 110.0%, Campbelltown City 102.9% and The Hills 100%. Twenty five were stable and there were two downtrends (Nepean -26.3% and The Hume -12.9%).

Note also that 32 of the 195 records in Table 4 fall under *Fraud* or *Theft of motor vehicle* offences, which may be associated with attempts to defraud insurance companies.

ⁱⁱ A Bureau audit of rejected incidents to March 2010 showed that 95 per cent to 100 per cent of rejected motor vehicle theft incidents were validly rejected, usually with the owner/driver having forgotten where they had left the vehicle.
