INTRODUCTION


This report has been prepared from inquests and inquiries heard before the City Coroner's Court, Glebe, which deals with approximately one third of coronial inquiries in N.S.W. each year.

The figures relate to inquiries conducted and finalised in 1981, not to deaths occurring in that year.

On the 16th April, 1980, a new Coroners Act was assented to, which replaced the Coroners Act of 1960. "Suspected deaths" have been included in the new legislation thus dispensing with the need for a "Magisterial inquiry" in cases where a body has not been recovered.

Coroners now have discretion under S.14(2) as to whether they will hold or dispense with an inquest. For this reason figures for Inquests Dispensed With are shown in this report.

The new Act came into effect on 1st July, 1980, and was taken into account in compiling "Sydney Coroner's Courts Statistics 1980". Comparisons with figures prior to that publication may be inhibited due to the legislative changes.

The figures understate the alcohol factor. Many victims survive for considerable periods after injury. Where death occurs more than 24 hours after injury, blood alcohol analysis is not ordered. Survival given for a few fours will result in a lower reading and in fact may result in a nil reading.
