COERCIVE CONTROL MONITORING REPORT Quarterly Report: September 2024

A new offence of coercive control commenced in NSW on 1 July 2024 (s54D, Crimes Act 1900)


The offence relates to abusive behaviours directed towards a current or former intimate partner with the intention to coerce or control them. The offence captures repeated patterns of physical or non-physical abuse used to hurt, scare, intimidate, threaten or control someone. The law applies to behaviour from 1 July 2024. This report shows the operation of the new offence.

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

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1.4 Offences co-occurring with coercive control



46% or 35 events: coercive control was the only recorded offence

54% or 41 events: multiple offences were recorded in the event, the most common co-occurring offences were:

- DV assault recorded in 30% of events
- Intimidation/stalking recorded in 30% of events
- Sexual assault recorded in 8% of events

2 charges have been laid for coercive control


1 of these coercive control charges was later withdrawn by the prosecution. The second coercive control charge was still pending court finalisation as at mid-November 2024.

1.6 Nature of charges laid on the criminal event

Coercive control charge only	0	0%
Coercive control charge plus other charge/s	2	3%
No coercive control charge but other charge/s	28	37%
Total coercive control events	76	100%

The two coercive control events with a coercive control charge both also involved charges for other DFV offences. Another 28 coercive control events resulted in charges for other DFV offences, but no coercive control charge.

The most common types of charges arising from criminal events with a coercive control incident were for DV assault, intimidation / stalking, and property damage.





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





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
Persons legally proceeded against for a coercive control charge


2 persons were legally proceeded against in the three months to September 2024.

Both were male, non-Aboriginal and aged between 30 and 49 years.


3.1 Persons legally proceeded against for coercive control charge by age
